# DRUG TRAFFICKING



### About The Course

The international trafficking of illegal narcotics and other pharmaceuticals has been a global problem for over a century. From the Opium Wars of the 1800s to the current battles among drug cartels in Mexico, this course offers an in- depth analysis of the epidemic of drug abuse and its association with crime.

The purpose of this course is to expose students, academics , police personals, criminal investigation agencies etc. to a variety of topics and broaden their understanding of the problem.

Objectives of the course includes familiarizing with the depth and breadth of the global drug trafficking problems through study and critical analysis of governmental reports for specific world regions as evidenced within recently published reports of agencies such as the Report of the International Narcotics Control Bureau (INCB Report 2015), the World Drug Report published by UNODC and other Reports published by the Governments of the specific countries. The Characteristics of Criminal organizations involved in drug trafficking will also be discussed. The course has also aimed for the participants to understand India's problems with the whole gamut of possible issues such as illegal cultivation of opium and cannabis, diversion from legally grown opium, clandestine labs (starting from makeshift heroin making facilities to sophisticated factories manufacturing Methaqualone, MDMA, etc.), smuggling of drugs into the country, smuggling of drugs out of the country, trafficking of drugs through the country, abuse of drugs, diversion of precursors, etc.

#### Prof. Ujala Joshi Jubert

Prof. Jubert is specialized in penal law. She also specializes in consulting of lawyers buffets. She directs and carries out research programs in the Theory of Crime, Socioeconomic Crimes and Gender Violence. She has trained professionally in Spain and Germany and has developed her teaching career in Germany, England South America and Spain. She has the experience of working as Substitute Judge High Court of Justice of Catalonia, Spain and Substitute Judge of the Provincial Court of Barcelona, Spain; Director and legal adviser at International Centre for Dispute Resolution (ICDR); Legal adviser on

battered women issues; Legal adviser to the government on legal issues, UB Foundations Group, University of Barcelona. Prof. Ujala has produced several opinions, two of them for public institutions in Catalonia (Generalitat de Catalunya and Cornellá City Hall), Spain. The third one had been produced in a matter of corruption in Supreme Courte of Justice, Spain on the request of the government of Peru.
