Overview:

Chronic Hepatitis encompasses a series of liver disorders which have varying severity and multiple causes, with a common feature of hepatic inflammation and necrosis. Inflammation and necrosis should continue for 6 months before a liver condition is labelled as chronic hepatitis. The spectrum of this disease may vary from mild forms which may have low levels of inflammation to severe forms associated with scarring and cirrhosis. Common causes of Chronic hepatitis include hepatitis B and C viruses, autoimmune hepatitis and certain drugs. Early detection and prompt treatment of chronic hepatitis are essential as there are effective drugs now available for most of the types of hepatitis. Also, early intervention prevents the risk of hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC) which is a sequel of many types of viral hepatitis.

Objectives: One Week Course

1. To sensitise the participants to the growing menace of chronic hepatitis.
2. To educate about the changing trends in diagnosis and treatment of chronic hepatitis.
3. To involve the participants in case discussions and hands-on training on the evaluation and assessment of patients of chronic hepatitis.
4. To deliberate upon the preventive aspects and the modalities to circumvent complications regarding chronic hepatitis.
